### Suite<sup>Link®</sup> Software Interface Developer Certification Procedures

Attention Applicant: Suite<sup>Link</sup> Developers are prohibited from representing to third parties that USPS has certified Developer's software product until USPS issues a software certification notice to Developer as described in Step 4, below. Prior to receiving the software certification notice from USPS, Developer may only represent that it has "applied" to receive software certification, and is prohibited from making any representations or warranties as to the availability of its software and/or the ability of its software to support the Suite<sup>Link</sup> Product.

Full requirements are set forth in the USPS Suite<sup>Link</sup> License Agreements and related documents. In the event of a conflict between this document and the standard Suite<sup>Link</sup> License Agreement, the terms of the Suite<sup>Link</sup> License Agreement prevail.

The following material describes the process for a Developer to qualify for a license and certify a Suite<sup>Link</sup> software interface. Information for each step of the certification process is included.

Developer must submit all materials to USPS at the following address:

#### Step 1. Application and Self-Certification Statement Approval

The following documentation must be completed and submitted by Developer and approved by the USPS:

- Application
- · Confidentiality Statement
- Self-Certification Statement
- Key Personnel Listing
- Security Documentation

USPS will notify Developer if it determines that Developer has completed Step 1 to the satisfaction of USPS.

#### Step 2. Software Development

Upon successful completion and approval of Step 1, USPS will forward a Suite<sup>Link</sup> Software Interface Developer License Agreement ("License Agreement") bearing licensee company name for signature. **The Suite<sup>Link</sup> Software Interface License Agreement must be signed by an officer who possesses the necessary legal authority to sign on behalf of the company, firm, or organization.** Developer must return the original signed License Agreement to USPS. After USPS receives the signed License Agreement and completes its review, USPS will execute the License Agreement and forward a copy of the fully executed Software Interface Developer License Agreement and Software Developer Kit (SDK) to the new Suite<sup>Link</sup> Software Interface Developer.

The SDK includes a Software Developer Guide (SDG) and sample code and sample data to facilitate software development. Developer's software interface must meet the requirements set forth in the SDG and the Software Performance Requirements (SPR).

A Suite<sup>Link</sup> Stage I test file will be available for testing through the assigned internet account. This file will contain test questions and the expected answers.

NOTE: All source code designed to access the secure data store technology of Suite<sup>Link</sup> shall be considered Confidential Information and is subject to the provisions of the Confidentiality Statement.

### Step 3. Suite Link Testing & Certification

Developer must submit to USPS a written request and a completed Software Product Information Form requesting that USPS perform a Suite<sup>Link</sup> certification Stage II test. The USPS will notify Developer when it has sent a test file. (While Suite<sup>Link</sup> testing will usually occur remotely, USPS reserves the right to perform testing on-site and/or request a copy of Developer's software interface for testing purposes).

The following items are tested in Step 3:

- Ability to correctly process test files
- Ability to provide an appropriate return suite (secondary) information in accordance with the Suite<sup>Link</sup> Product requirements
- Ability to produce output file and return codes
- Understanding and performance of administrative requirements which includes processing the certification test and submitting the proper documents and/or reports.

If USPS determines that Developer fails the initial certification test, Developer may submit to USPS a written request for an additional certification test.

#### Step 4. USPS Interface Certification

Upon USPS determining that Developer has successfully completed Steps 1 - 3, USPS will issue a software certification notice to Developer.

In the event Developer desires to sell or distribute its software to third parties, Developer <u>must</u> enter into a separate license agreement with USPS. Developer's Suite<sup>Link</sup> interface software SHALL NOT be used, sold and/or distributed unless it has entered into a Suite<sup>Link</sup> Interface Distributor License Agreement with USPS.

## Step 1 Suite<sup>Link®</sup> Software Interface Developer Application

#### **Terms and Conditions of Application for License**

- 1. Applicant understands and agrees that the Suite<sup>Link</sup> product may only be used by Applicant or parties using Applicant's Suite<sup>Link</sup> software program(s) ("software") to update existing mailing lists that are used to prepare mail for the purpose of acceptance and delivery by the United States Postal Service.
- 2. In consideration for a Suite<sup>Link</sup> Interface Developer License, a potential Licensee must demonstrate the capability and past performance of writing USPS Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS)-certified software, and that licensing of this technology to the applicant is in the best interest of the USPS. **The applicant will submit the Self-Certification Statement, along with this application** to enable USPS to make this determination.
- 3. Applicant is not eligible to receive a Suite<sup>Link</sup> Software Developer Interface Certification prior to USPS: (a) completing its acceptance testing of the software, (b) determining, in its sole discretion, that the testing is successful, and (3) certifying the Applicant's specific Suite<sup>Link</sup> software.
- 4. Applicant is prohibited from representing to third parties that USPS has certified Applicant's software until such time Applicant receives a software certification notice from USPS. Prior to receiving the software certification notice from USPS, Applicant may only represent that it has "applied" to receive software certification, and is prohibited from making any representations or warranties as to the availability of its software and/or the ability of its software to support the Suite<sup>Link</sup> product.
- 5. USPS is not liable for any and all costs incurred by the Applicant, its affiliates, agents or employees for the submission of this Application and related materials, or the development or testing of Applicant's proposed Suite Link software.
- 6. Applicant must be in good standing under all existing license agreements with USPS, if any, and has received no notice of warning, suspension or termination from USPS relating either to a current or expired USPS license agreement.
- USPS may elect not to award Applicant a Software Interface Developer license agreement in the event that USPS determines that Applicant has violated any of the terms and conditions set forth above.
- 8. Applicant shall submit written notice to USPS of any material change to the information submitted as part of the application and supporting documents within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of such change.
