

Own a Piece of PCC History 2021 National PCC Day Celebration Limited Edition Special Pictorial Postmark



Don't miss out on your opportunity to own a piece of PCC History. As we continue to "Celebrate 60 Years of the PCC", the PCC Advisory Committee (PCCAC) Communications and Marketing Sub-Committee in collaboration with four USPS Celebration Stations and the USPS Stamp Fulfillment Services has created a limited-edition Special Pictorial Postmark "Celebrating 60 Years of the PCC", as well as the 2021 National PCC Day Celebration.

PCCs and PCC members will have two opportunities to obtain this beautiful cachet and/or Special Pictorial Postmark.

1. PCCs - The National PCC Program Office will be mailing a limited number of cachets containing all four unique Special Pictorial Postmarks to each PCC. PCCs will have the discretion of deciding how they will distribute the Special Pictorial Postmarks to their members. They can either raffle off the cachets or gift them to their members during an upcoming PCC event. The choice is yours. To receive your limited supply of cachets, your PCC Postal Administrator, PCC Postal Co-Chair, or Industry Co-Chair must

provide a contact name and mailing address to where you would like your cachets shipped to. Please email that information to your Headquarters PCC Liaison.

- 2. Individual PCC Members or individuals who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date. All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced. Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark. Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under the addressed protective cover.
