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1.0 Introduction

On Sunday, February 24, 2019, the United States Postal Service implemented the following software change:

2.0 Mail.dat Client Support

Please note the following regarding the Mail.dat client download.

There is an **optional** new Mail.dat client version with this release. Users can download updated **Mail.dat client version 48.0.2.1_PROD** from the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) using the following path: Mailing Services → Electronic Data Exchange [Go to Service] → Mail.dat download (Windows 32-bit, Windows 64-bit or Solaris). The updated client removes references to unused JavaServer Pages (JSPs) and removes outdated filters from the Web Services XML. There is no change to functionality, and these technical changes do not impact users.

3.0 PostalOne! System - Corrections to Known Issues

3.1 Electronic Data Exchange

A new optional Mail.dat client (48.0.2.1_PROD) is available with this release. The updated Mail.dat client removes references to unused JavaServer Pages (JSPs) and removes outdated filters from the Web Services XML. These technical changes apply to the overall electronic data exchange system (including the existing Mail.dat client); therefore, the updated Mail.dat client is optional. There is no change to functionality, and no impact to users. 13030

3.2 Electronic Verification System (eVS®)

eVS Sampling has been updated to price First-Class Package Service (FCPS) samples with Negotiated Service Agreement (NSA) contracts. Previously, these samples were unable to be priced due to an issue that appeared following the January 27, 2019 Price Change. The pricing methodology for FCPS samples with NSA contracts has been updated to correct the issue for future samples of this type, and the impacted samples in February were repriced. 13021 (20359-R)
