Scope:

Business shipments via ground of limited quantity or consumer commodities by small parcel carriers in the US. This would encompass business to business (B2B) and business to consumer (B2C).

COSTHA Mission:

Safe and efficient transportation of dangerous goods, through global harmonization



e-commerce Working Group

Council on Safe Transportation of Hazardous Articles

Goal:

To find an automated solution for the application of limited quantity marks for e-commerce shipments (ground US).

- Automation to eliminate human error;
- Add efficiencies and consistent placement of the marking;
- Top of the package placement will simplify the approval process; and
- Provide additional aide in ensuring packages intended for ground transport are not offered for air transport.





Next Steps

- Visibility tests ability to recognize the limited quantity marking
- Safety evaluation / data

Future

 Special Permit request PHMSA – allow smaller LTD QTY mark on larger packages incorporated into the shipping label.
