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### 1.0 Introduction

On Sunday, July 29, 2018, the United States Postal Service will implement the following software change:

# 2.0 Seamless Acceptance and Service Performance (SASP) – Corrections to Known Issues

## 2.1 Mail Quality Data

Seamless Acceptance and Service Performance (SASP) will be updated to ensure the invoice period is set to the first day of the mailing month for the Nesting/Sortation Daily Mail Quality Data (MQD) feed. Currently, the process incorrectly uses the Mailing Date as the invoice period when retrieving the Nesting/Sortation Daily MQD warning data. As a result, mailers who are enrolled in MQD for the Nesting/Sortation Daily Feed may see inaccurate warning volume for the invoice period. Error data provisioned to mailers via Informed Delivery may be incorrectly formatted.

# 2.2 SASP Error Reporting

An issue will be corrected that can sometimes result in the Mailer Scorecard reflecting inflated Handling Unit (HU) error counts and inflated postage due under certain conditions. The issue can occur for logical-based co-palletized jobs with physical HUs whose siblings are logical. When a job of this type is reversed, the job is deactivated but the physical HUs and their errors fail to be deactivated, resulting in inflated HU errors and potentially inflated postage due displaying on the Mailer Scorecard. 4680
