### 2.0 Mail.dat Client Support

Please note the following regarding the Mail.dat client download.

There is no new Mail.dat client version with this release. Users should continue to use Mail.dat client version **48.1.0.0\_PROD.** The current Mail.dat client may be downloaded from the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) using the following path: Mailing Services → Electronic Data Exchange [Go to Service] → Mail.dat download (Windows 32-bit, Windows 64-bit or Solaris).

# 3.0 PostalOne! System - Corrections to Known Issues

#### 3.1 Mail.XML Performance

Performance was improved to alleviate the slow response times and exceptions users recently experienced with Mail.XML submissions. Mail.XML processing was updated to implement "retry" methodology, which automatically retries Mail.XML submissions that fail with a socket exception error. The retry is executed up to three (3) times before an exception error is generated. The issue did not impact the processing of Mail.XML data once it was received, although some users had to cancel their Mail.XML jobs and resubmit them after the initial submission failure. 20591-R
