## 1.0 Introduction

On Sunday, June 30, 2019, the United States Postal Service implemented the following software change:

- *PostalOne!* System Release 49.0.1.1

These Release Notes provide the contents of the release and affected subsystems.

The section titled **Corrections to Known Issues** is derived from External Trouble Reports (ETRs) and Engineering Change Requests (ECRs) for inclusion in this release.

This document is prepared based on the knowledge available at the time of its publication and any element may be subject to change prior to publication.

## 2.0 Mail.dat Client Support

There is no new Mail.dat client version with this release. Users should continue to use Mail.dat client version 49.0.0.0\_PROD. The current Mail.dat Client may be downloaded from the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) using the following path: Mailing Services → Electronic Data Exchange [Go to Service] → Mail.dat download (Windows 32-bit, Windows 64-bit or Solaris).

## 3.0 *PostalOne!* System - Corrections to Known Issues

### 3.1 Business Reply Mail (BRM)

An issue was corrected to enable Business Reply Mail (BRM) pieces on Intelligent Mail barcode Accounting (IMbA) transaction requests to be processed. Previously, BRM pieces on IMbA transactions with lines that are eligible for dimensional pricing encountered an issue that prevented them from being accepted/processed. As a result, the BRM pieces had to be manually processed and assessed by the BMEU. [13372 \(20711-R\)](#)

### 3.2 Electronic Verification System (eVS®)

- An issue was corrected that previously prevented some customers from receiving the correct rates on flat-rate mail pieces for Priority Mail and Priority Mail Open and Distribute (PMOD). [13368 \(20704-R\)](#)
- eVS was updated to resolve an issue in the way in which oversized and non-machinable parcels are determined. This previously resulted in some mail pieces receiving the incorrect rates for oversized and non-machinable parcels. A defect in the evaluation logic for the dimensions provided on the manifest was corrected. [13370 \(20706-R\)](#)
- eVS dimensional weight evaluation logic was revised to ensure that Priority Mail Open and Distribute (PMOD) mail pieces are not subjected to dimensional pricing. Previously, a defect incorrectly priced some PMOD pieces with dimensional pricing under certain conditions. [13371 \(20707-R\)](#)
