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1.0 Introduction

On Sunday, October 6, 2019, the United States Postal Service implemented the following software change:

- *PostalOne!* System Release 49.1.1.1

2.0 Mail.dat Client Support

Please note the following regarding the Mail.dat client download.

There is no new Mail.dat client with this release. Users can continue to use Mail.dat client **49.1.0.0_PROD**, or the optional updated client **49.1.1.0_PROD** that was made available on September 15, 2019 to support implementation of a verification list and new warning message for ineligible Informed Delivery campaigns through the *PostalOne!* System. Both Mail.dat clients are available from the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) using the following path: Mailing Services → Electronic Data Exchange [Go to Service] → Mail.dat download (Windows 32-bit, Windows 64-bit or Solaris).

3.0 *PostalOne!* System - Corrections to Known Issues

3.1 Electronic Data Exchange

The *PostalOne!* System was updated to resolve a performance issue that previously delayed some Seamless Mail.dat jobs from completing within the expected processing time. The issue impacted Seamless Mail.dat job submissions that include Container Summary (.csm) files or Container Quantity (.cqt) files ranging in size from 300,000 to 2 million records. For Seamless Mail.dat submissions in this scenario, processing times of up to 10 hours occurred. The excess processing time resulted in auto-finalization delays, and in some cases required clerks to manually process the postage statement. [13580](#)
