Even though the Sacramento PCC faces challenges due to the current COVID-19 pandemic (i.e., social distancing, stay-at-home policy, etc.), they are doing an excellent job of keeping their members fully engaged. The PCC continues to use traditional forms of communication that utilizes the mail, newsletters, save-the-date postcards, and letters from their Executive Board members. Moreover, the Sacramento PCC continues to use email blasts and partner with their District Marketing team.

Innovatively, the PCC stepped outside the box and started using the *Zoom* platform to keep their membership engaged and excited. The technology has allowed them to host national speakers who will attract attention and conduct follow-up and feedback sessions through *town-hall* style meetings via *Zoom*.

One of the key strengths of the Sacramento PCC is to provide world-class educational content for their members. Continuing to do so has avoided members from drifting away during the pandemic. They are planning to host two *Zoom* meetings per month. Topics include:
