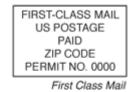

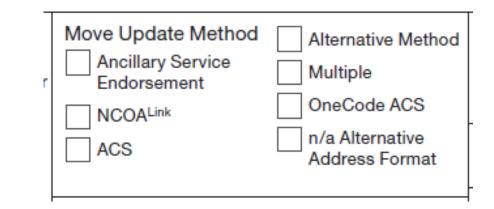

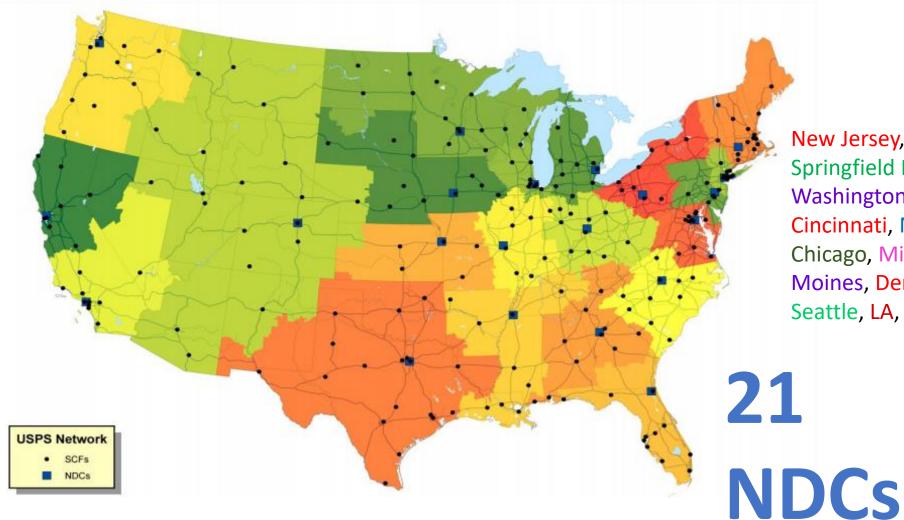


- AADC Automated Area Distribution Center
  - A distribution center that uses barcodes sorters and other equipment designed for processing automation compatible mail.
- NDC Network Distribution Center
  - Large highly mechanized processing plant that distributes Marketing Mail and Package Services for multiple states.
- SCF Sectional Center Facility
  - A postal facility that serves as the processing and distribution center for an area defined by the first 3 digits of the ZIP code. Some SCF's serve more than one range.
- DDU Destination Delivery Unit
  - Local Post Office.
- P&DC Processing and Distribution Center
  - Processing plant that sorts and dispatches mail for a designed service area.
- DNDC & DSCF These are rates not places

Robert Moon is considered the father of the ZIP codes. He introduced his proposal in 1944 while working as a postal inspector. The post office credits Mr. Moon with the first 3 digits of the zip code which describe the SCF. The fourth and fifth digits which give a more precise location within the SCF, were proposed by Henry Bentley Hahn, Sr. Zip codes were introduced nationwide on July 1, 1963.
