RETAIL DISTRIBUTION CODE FILE PROCESSING

The Retail Distribution Code Assignment file available for download on the Operations web page of the USPS PostalPro website (https://postalpro.usps.com/operations). Both files are comma separated .csv files use the same file format, but there are two data formats:

- 1) Ranged destination Start/End ZIPs (i.e. 005 ZIP Start, 999 ZIP End)
- 2) Individual destination Start/End ZIPs (i.e. 005 ZIP Start, 005 ZIP End)

LOGIC TO DETERMINE CORRECT RDC

To obtain an RDC from the Assignment File select the RDC (column #5/E):

Where:

first 3 digits of Entry Facility ZIP (from ZIP) matches Origin ZIP (column #1/A) and

first 3 digits of Destination ZIP is >= ZIP Start (column #2/B) and

first 3 digits of Destination ZIP is <= ZIP End (column #3/C) and

If mail class is Priority Mail Express:

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "001"

If mail class is Priority Mail:

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "003" (Machinable) or "008" (Non-Machinable)

If mail class is First Class Mail (Letters or Flats):

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "004"

If mail class is Parcel Select:

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "005"

If mail class is Package Services (Library, Media Mail, and Bound Printed Matter):

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "006" (Machinable) or "106" (Non-Machinable)

If mail class is USPS Ground Advantage:

MC Set Code (#4/D) is "009" (Machinable) or "106" (Non-Machinable)
